

Services were to be held today for David C. Jones, executive director of the Homemaker Service of the Metropolitan Area Inc., who died Wednesday. He was 44 and lived in the Mount Airy section of Philadelphia.

Jones had been with Homemaker Service, a non-profit United Way agency that provides nursing and health care to homebound people, since 1973. Before going to Home Service, Jones held a number of positions in the health-care field, including program director of the West Philadelphia Community Mental Health Consortium and director of social services at the Northwestern Mental Health Center in Philadelphia.

He attended Central High School and graduated from Temple University. He received a master's degree in social work from the University of Pennsylvania.

Jones was active in cultural and civic affairs and was a member and former president of the Mendelssohn Club of Philadelphia, a semi-professional choral group that has made recordings with the Philadelphia Orchestra. He was also a member of Omega Psi Phi, a national service fraternity, and a former member of the Men of Cliveden.

He was a board member of the Pennsylvania Council for Homemaker-Home Health Aide Service, chairman of the Southeastern Pennsylvania Regional Association of Homemaker-Home Health Aide Executives and a member of the Professional Advisory Committee of the United Way of Southeastern Pennsylvania.

Survivors include his wife, Anna Simpson Jones; three daughters, Nancy Elizabeth, Susan Hillary and Mary Allison; a son, Steven Bradley; and his parents, Jesse S. and Grace Jones.

Services were to be this morning at Holy Cross Lutheran Church, 500 E. Mount Pleasant Ave. Burial will be in Fairview Cemetery, Willow Grove, Montgomery County.
