

HERBERT LINTON SCHEUFELE

(July 1, 1928 – March 20, 2025)



Herbert Linton Scheufele, of Ocean City, NJ passed away on March 20, 2025 surrounded by his family. He was born in Philadelphia to the late Helen Linton and Herbert Christian Scheufele. Herb is survived by his wife of 64 years, Virginia (nee Knoedler), his sister Ruth Kuch and her husband Leonard, his brother Stephen and his wife Judy, nephew Thomas Kuch and his wife Heather, nieces Gretchen and Stephanie Scheufele, great nephews Gavin and Landon Kuch and great nieces Sarah and Molly Esposito. His niece Karen Kuch Esposito predeceased him.

Herb was a distinguished graduate and member of the Barnwell Honor Society of Central High School, in Philadelphia; and graduated Magna Cum Laude from Drexel Institute of Technology, as a Distinguished Military Graduate with a degree in Commerce and Engineering.

He proudly served a combined total of 6 years active and reserve duty as an Infantry officer and company commander in the US Army.

He worked for 30 years for the Bell Telephone Company of Pennsylvania and retired as Director of Engineering- Diamond State (Delaware) Telephone Company. During his career he was a District Director of Outside Plant Engineering for both Philadelphia-North and Pittsburg-West. He was also an instructor of long range planning at the Bell System Center for Technical Education in Lisle, Illinois, and the first District Director of newly formed Bell Atlantic Regional Engineering, Construction and Line Assignment Staff.

He was an active member of Holy Trinity Church, Ocean City NJ, serving as Clerk of the Vestry for 5 years, two- two year terms as Senior Warden and Chairman of the Centennial Committee, Parish Profile Committee and Organ Selection Purchase Committee.

He was an active member of the Patcong Valley Society of Model Railroaders and served as Secretary for 15 years.

Herb and Virginia traveled the world extensively, frequently on Lindblad Expeditions and enjoyed bird watching together. He was a great dog lover, an avid reader, a model railroad enthusiast, and enjoyed playing sports. He also enjoyed watching sports on TV, especially football.

The memorial service will be held at Holy Trinity Episcopal Church, Ocean City NJ, on April 28th, 2025. Visitation will be held at 10 AM, service at 11 AM, followed by a luncheon in the church fellowship hall.
